Nature Notes



As the weather warmed up in the second week of March, suddenly signs of spring were all around. Frog activity in our pond has lead to several large clumps of frogspawn. Hosts of golden daffodils (as someone once said) appeared in gardens and on verges, taking over from the rather tired looking snowdrops. Green tinges on both hedge and tree hold promise of beautiful fresh leaves soon to be enriching

our lives. Extra work may also be in store, especially for the farmers. There are many plants and seeds to be planted - and as a new cycle of life begins there is, of course, the lawn mowing to do!

The garden birds are also hard at work, preparing nests, guarding territories and looking for food for their new families. For several hours each morning and evening, a song thrush has perched on a treetop near our bedroom window. His song is such sweet music. Tricky to sleep through, though, if you do not need to be awake at 6 a.m. (and getting earlier by the day)! A couple of unusual visitors to our bird feeders in March have been a pair of siskin and a pair of tree sparrows. Siskin we have occasionally seen before but the tree sparrows are newcomers to our garden. House sparrows, blue tits and robins have been using the nest boxes so far but we still have a couple of vacancies!



Weather Watch

Dilwyn Weather for February 2017

Just below two and a half inches of rain fell (60mm), which has been about average over the past six years (apart from the very wet year of 2014 when both January and February had 7 inches of rain). We had a couple of breezy spells and also Storm Doris, which gave

us quite a blow! Sunshine again was in short supply, with only 3 days being 'mostly sunny' leaving us to complain about the cloudy, misty, drizzly conditions. Ten nights had a frost, none severe. The daytime average temperature reached 9 degrees with a couple of days reaching the low teens (again, about average for the past 6 years). **AR**

We usually think of pets as those domestic creatures we choose to look after and live with. This is not the normal story of a domesticated pet but of a wild creature that adopted Gaynor and I. A few years ago we happened to be staying in a rented cottage in the Lake District. On the first morning we settled down to breakfast and I gazed out of the French windows to see a fully grown fox sitting on a raised bank at the end of the garden and staring in at us. He seemed unconcerned and stayed until breakfast was over then casually rose, turned and sauntered off into the woods behind.

On the second day, the same thing happened again, we having breakfast and Reynard sitting and staring back at us. I said to Gaynor that I thought he was expecting us to feed him. At this point a male pheasant strode into view along the bank towards the fox. 'Oh dear' was uttered as we expected feathers to fly at any second. Reynard slowly turned his head towards the approaching pheasant but unperturbed the bird nonchalantly continued to within ten feet of the fox. Without breaking stride the pheasant wandered behind the fox and into the woods along the same path from which Reynard had emerged. The fox returned every day of our stay and we began throwing out the breakfast scraps which were taken with relish. Said pheasant continued to make an appearance occasionally, totally unconcerned at Reynard's presence. At first we were astonished at this unusual behaviour. Even today we can't quite believe that a wild animal had adopted us, accepted our food and had overlooked a more substantial and natural meal. Now, if you happen to be reading this on April 1st, the incident did happen. Really!

Launch Virtual Reality App for Young Drivers & Passengers

The Safer Roads Partnership in Warwickshire and West Mercia have launched 'DriveVR' - an innovative new Virtual Reality app for young drivers and passengers, providing real-life driving experiences and allowing young people to see the outcomes of bad driving decisions to encourage them not to make the same mistakes in real life. DriveVR is one of the first Virtual Reality (VR) initiatives in the UK promoting road safety messages. Aimed at young drivers and passengers aged 16-24, DriveVR aims to highlight how a split-second decision in the car as a driver or passenger could change the rest of your life. The app is free to download for iPhone and Android and allows players to choose and customise a character and explore their social media timelime, before encountering fully immersive VR driving events.

It's a Small World

Our daughter Ellie, who now lives in London, was very surprised to walk into a New Forest hotel and to see a print of Dilwyn on the wall. Some of the girls with her were, obviously, very sceptical when told that the print was of Dilwyn where she used to live.



The print is one of a pair from an original painting by Ron Moseley, born 1931 in Marple, Cheshire and still alive and well, but very difficult to contact.

Obviously the original was not painted at the time depicted but possibly in the 60s or 70s from a photograph or postcard, perhaps with the figures added to imply a certain time in history. The painting also shows Wren Cottage without a porch but this may simply be artistic licence.

There is a photograph in the Dilwyn Crown bar showing a very similar but slightly more recent view and also showing a tall building on the left and a different roof profile on the building in front of it.

I have found that the original was sold to a dealer in July 2016 by an auction house in Glasgow and that it has since been sold on. I have no more information but maybe someone out there does have something to add!!

Emergency Medical Advice

- •Taurus Healthcare is a company that has been set up by the GPs in Herefordshire to provide additional medical services to patients. There are now three primary care hubs (Leominster, Ross and Hereford) open in the county that provide GP and Practice Nursing services for our patients during the evenings and weekends. The hubs are staffed by local GPs and nurses, who will, with your permission, be able to access your medical records. If you need to make an appointment at one of the hubs but your surgery is closed, please phone 111 and ask for an appointment at one of the hubs, alternatively you can ring direct on 0800 121 7221. The Hereford hub is open 6pm to 8pm weekdays and 8am to 8pm weekends and bank holidays.
- There is a GP Walk-In Access Centre at ASDA in Hereford which is open from 8am until 8pm, seven days a week and every day of the year. There is no need to register. You can use these services when it is convenient and keep registered with your practice.
- •You can telephone 111. NHS 111 is a new service to make it easier for you to access local NHS healthcare services in England. NHS 111 is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Calls are free from landlines and mobile phones. You should use the NHS 111 service if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation.

The NHS 111 service is staffed by a team of fully trained advisers, supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. They will ask you questions to assess your symptoms, then give you the healthcare advice you need or direct you straightaway to the local service that can help you best.

Where possible, the NHS 111 team will book you an appointment or transfer you directly to the people you need to speak to. If NHS 111 advisers think you need an ambulance, they will immediately arrange for one to be sent to you. Calls to 111 are recorded. All calls and the records created are maintained securely, and will only be shared with others directly involved with your care. Call 111 if:

Oyou need medical help fast but it's not a 999 emergency
Oyou think you need to go to A&E or need another NHS urgent care service
Oyou don't know who to call or you don't have a GP to call
Oyou need health information or reassurance about what to do next

• A&E is designed to assess and treat people with serious injuries and those in need of emergency treatment. They are open 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year. Typical reasons for going to A&E include:

Osevere breathing problems Ohead injuries Osevere abdominal pain Ochest pain and heart attacks Olack of consciousness Odrug overdose

Osevere bleeding Osevere burns or scalds

Omajor trauma Obroken bones

Normal cuts, bruises and sprains aren't usually considered to be emergencies since these can usually be treated at home or by your GP. A&E shouldn't be used as an alternative to your GP.


