Parish Council Matters

2. *The full, approved minutes of Dilwyn Parish Council meetings, as prepared by the Parish Clerk, are published regularly on the Village Notice Boards and Council Website. What follows here summarises matters of particular interest and any decisions taken at a specific meeting.*

The Regular Meeting of Dilwyn Parish Council held in the St. Mary's CE Primary School, Dilwyn on Tuesday, 6th February, 2018

At this meeting, 11 Councillors were present, with an apology from Cllr. E. Stilwell. The Parish Clerk, Mr. Gwilym Rippon, and the Ward Councillor, Mr. Mark Cooper, were in attendance together with three members of the public.

a. Public Participation:

- To receive the Police report.
There was no police officer present.
- To receive the Ward Councillor's report.
The Ward Councillor gave a verbal report. A copy of this report has been placed on the Parish Council Website.
- A member of the public asked why the Lengths-man had not undertaken any work in the area. It was explained that if any work was needed it would be best to e-mail the Clerk directly. Fresh instructions would be issued to the Lengths-man regarding necessary work.
- Another member of the public asked if the Council was planning anything for litter-day (3rd March). It was pointed out that litter-collection in the village was well looked-after by certain members of the community.
- A third questioner asked about food at the Crown; he was told that every effort was being made to resolve the problem.

b. To approve the General Parish Council meeting on Thursday, 4th January 2018

It was agreed that the following be added to the previous minutes:

The authorised signatories in the mandate for the current Crown Inn account. should be changed to include Cllr. P. Stilwell.

RESOLVED

The minutes of the Council meeting on Thursday, 4th January 2018 were approved as amended.

c. Information arising from the minutes.

The Clerk was requested to write to residents of Probert Crescent regarding the December minute suggesting that:

they include both Probert Crescent and Penrose in their address, to avoid confusion to delivery drivers. If there are any further problems they might get better service from Herefordshire Council than from Dilwyn Parish Council.

The Clerk was requested to purchase 2 extra grit bins.

There was nothing to report under this heading.

e. Finance:

- The Clerk reported the following

Burnt House, the roadway is falling away. Tump Ash to the Haven: the ditches are blocked. High Elms: the road is potholed. There are road signs needing repair: at The Firs, at the crossroads sign; Leominster end of the by-pass. .

g. Planning matters

There was nothing to report under this heading.

j. Update on the Neighbourhood plan

It was reported that there was concern that matters were moving very slowly. It was pointed out that there were issues with the time that members have available to devote to progressing matters.

k. The Crown Inn

Cllr. S. Thomas gave a full financial update in relation to the Crown Inn. A copy of this information may be seen on the Council website.
The Clerk reported that he had been in touch with Paul Kenyon who stated that he was still interested in taking on the redundant building and also stated that he would produce a report for the March meeting.

NDP Steering Group Update

Sadly owing to ill-health Deborah Bruton has stepped down as secretary of the steering group. The village owes her a big vote of thanks for all the hard work she has done over the past 20 months to get us to where we are today.

So where are we?

The questionnaires were completed and the information analysed by Data Orchard last summer (both on the council website). A Housing Needs Plan for Dilwyn has been completed by AECOM (council website) and a draft plan (council website) was displayed in the Hall in October/November 2017 and comments were received from parishioners.

To move things on the steering group have met twice in February 2018 (minutes available) and have used this information to produce site criteria. These criteria are currently being used to assess land offered by various Dilwyn landowners. A report will then be produced and the information will be used to form the foundation of the NDP. At this point there will be a further consultation with the village. Any necessary amendments will be made and then the plan will pass to the Herefordshire Council. If the planners find the plan in order it then goes forward to a parish referendum.

Green Spaces are also being looked at by the Steering Group and areas can be identified and protected from development so as to maintain the natural beauty and the local heritage of Dilwyn village, something that is important to us all. (In the survey over 90% of households saw this as a priority).

A long exasperating process, but one that will eventually help our village develop in a way that we as a community want it to develop, not just as Herefordshire Council want it to be. Housing needs can be met in a way that will maintain the wonderful character and uniqueness of Dilwyn. So far all assessments and consultations have highlighted the need for some family and low cost housing to allow young families to find homes in the village, so addressing the inevitable problems caused by living in a village where many of us are steadily advancing in years!

Nature Notes



A couple of cold spells with days of snow cover may have suggested that spring should be put on hold for a while. But life goes on for all wild creatures and the warmer days in between were soon alive with bird song and croaking frogs. Our garden pond was frozen solid for days but a few days later as temperatures lifted into the teens, suddenly there were the seething mass of amphibians, all eager to mate and lay their eggs. Frog and toad spawn must be resilient because within a week another cold spell from the east froze the pond once again. Will this affect how many hatch out? We shall have to wait and see.

Some unusual birds have been spotted in gardens during the cold weather. Several people have reported pheasants cleaning up under their bird feeders. A garden in Sollers Dilwyn has been visited by bramblings, which I have not seen before in the area. Redpolls have been seen on feeders just a few miles away - on several occasions. We have had regular visits from a couple of nuthatches, as well as at least a dozen goldfinches. With snow falling once again as I write, it seems hard to believe that in just 3 or 4 weeks, the first swallows are due to arrive!

P.S. Within a few hours of my sending in my notes, today in the snow (Sunday) we have seen a curlew then later a pair of reed buntings by the feeders in our garden. These are most unusual for a garden!

Weather Watch

Dilwyn Weather for February 2018

A rather meagre 1.4 inches of rain (36mm) was hardly 'February Fill Dike' as country lore of years gone by expected it to be! 14 out of the 28 days were actually dry and 9 of those were mostly sunny days. Plenty of night frosts (18 in all) reminded us that winter was still around and helped produce a night time average temperature of minus 2 degrees. The day time average was 9 degrees.

This particular month will be remembered more for the way it finished, than events which happened during the month. The final week saw winds turning to the east and temperatures dropping, with snow showers arriving, as the Beast from the East met Storm Emma to cause chaos into March, with drifting snow covering much of the country.
