Our expected speaker, Luke of Wye Valley Falconry, had cancelled a few days earlier but fortunately we managed to find a last-minute replacement for our meeting on 16th January. Dee White travelled from beyond Bromyard to be with us. She is an enthusiastic member of the Herefordshire Wildlife Trust, who also runs her own small charity looking after injured or orphaned animals. She currently has 24 hedgehogs in her care, a corn snake and various other creatures, many of them brought in by members of the public or the RSPCA. We heard about the care given to each animal before being returned to the wild. Dee also had an impressive array of skulls, all from British animals and ranging from deer to mice and rats, from a grey seal to a curlew and also including a wild boar. The crowd listened to her most attentively (sign of a good speaker?) and various questions were answered. As is the way with the Cedar Club, a delicious tea followed, with some really tempting morsels on both the sandwich and cake plates.

Following the usual raffle, members were reminded of the next meeting, which will be on 20th February at 2.30pm and brings Phil Morris from The Cart Shed (a local mental health charity), who is a most enthusiastic and interesting speaker. He will tell us about the work done by the charity and bring examples of items produced in the woods by participants on courses held there. Guests welcome (cost £2).

Dilwyn Weather for Dec 2019

Our very wet autumn continued into winter, with plentiful rain onto sodden ground causing local flooding (and a fair amount of complaining about the weather!). Just short of 5 inches (125mm) fell (adding to 5, 6 and 6 inches in the previous months – all above average) to boost the total for 2019 to just below 42 inches (1043mm). Since 2013, the totals have been 41, 31, 43, 33, 29, 34 and 42 inches, so 2019 was by no means unusual.

Average day time temperature, at 7 degrees, was slightly below our usual December figure, while the night time average of 2 degrees was much what we would expect. Eleven nights had a frost, the lowest being minus 5, so nothing too severe. Not a good time for lovers of sunshine though – only 4 days could be classed as 'mostly sunny' and cloudy, misty conditions were our usual fayre. A few very breezy days helped clear away the mist and one gale blew through at the end of week one, without causing any real damage. In summary, it was a fairly average December.

Nature Notes Part 1

A Hedge Revolution!

As I prune back my unruly *Rosa* 'Bobbie James', I notice above me an audience of 26 house sparrows – what a cheerful sight on a foggy morning! How lucky we are to have these UK Species Category Red birds, which have declined more than 50% over the past 25 years. We feed ours here and have hedges with holly in (which is great for shelter and from predators), along with eaves to nest in.

The loss of our hedgerows and annual cutting has had a huge impact on all our wildlife and after visiting the Knepp Estate Wilding project in West Sussex last summer, I was truly inspired. It is a huge experimental conservation project where they have had outstanding results, with the return of nightingales, turtle doves and purple emperor butterflies in record numbers (the list is extensive) and I recommend all to go on safari!

If we could manage our hedgerows on a 3-year rotation (as recommended by the NFU, Defra and Wildlife Trusts) we could see the return of all our hedgerow species, but without this direct action the continued decline is inevitable – a devastating loss. The Woodland Trust offers free advice on planting new hedgerows, provides support and grants of up to 75% of the costs (minimum hedge length 100m) or if you would prefer a quick delivery,



discounted hedge packs are available on their website. Defra has grants that can pay up to 100% of costs along with hedge laying grants etc. – there is no minimum requirement and grants are awarded on a points-based system. If you are lucky enough to have a garden, then plant a small tree like *Crataegus monogyna* (common hawthorn) or if you have just a window sill, then a bird feeder and nest box will go a long way to help our New Year Revolution!

Our first image comes from the Sandpits, just off the centre of the village. Although not an indigenous variety to this area, this early snowdrop (picture taken by Ellie Brown) on New Year's Day is a welcome reminder that spring is on its way and gives us hope for the coming year amidst this long wet winter we've been having.





The second budding image taken on 13th January is of a flowering cherry from

Gravel Hill at the end of the Sollers on the common. A wondrous promise of the fruit to come, but a niggling worry that the February and March frosts will bite and damage the beautiful pink blossoms. We hope it is hardy enough to weather the predicted snow that the long-term forecasts predict.

The final image needs no explanation, except to say what a singularly brave fellow this lovely little daisy is that I spotted on the 11th January. I suspect he will not be joined by any other friends for quite some time.



The birds hereabouts have been very lively, also under the misguided impression that spring is in the air. The wood pigeons have been creating quite a kerfuffle in the ivy bushels within our tree lines and

the sparrows and blue tits seem to be deciding whether they can squeeze in a quick brood before the weather changes. I hope their optimism pays off!

Finally, out the back is a feeder hanging from an aged apple tree. Here we have regular visits from the usual feathered characters with the occasional rarity for good measure – the high winds of Storm Brendan brought us a very brave and handsome fellow in the guise of a great spotted woodpecker! What an amusing sight he was, swinging wildly on the feeder determined to get a spot of dinner, and a most deserved prize for his daring do in such tempestuous circumstances. I hope he got his fill.

Pantomimes

In December 2018, the girls were in need of culture. To London and the Royal Shakespeare Company, plus another theatre, which was so memorable I have forgotten what it was, we went.

Not having been to one since before Offa was building his dyke, my choice was for a pantomime. That was until I found that Julian Clary at the London Palladium would cost us £125 a ticket!

We went instead to the Regal at Tenbury. Tickets £19 a head. The pantomime was Cinderella. This was traditional old-fashioned fun – clean and brilliantly witty. The whole production was managed "in house" and I laughed until the tears ran down. The great secret of course is to use as many local children as possible, ensuring adoring audiences. Knowing not one of those involved, we still absolutely loved it.

In 2019, I thought we should try a back-to-back comparison: The Regal v. The Courtyard. Snow White and the 7 Dwarves v. Cinderella – the Hereford version.

Once again, Snow White was wonderful. When the "mirror on the wall" was addressed by the wicked stepmother, it replied: "Your call is important to us – please hold on. You are number 17 in the queue."



Towards the end of Act 2, younger members of the audience were invited onto the stage and asked to say quickly the following: "One smart fellow he felt smart, 2 smart fellows they felt smart" etc. with the inevitable uproarious results. We booed the wicked stepmother. We "Oh no he isn't-ed" for Herefordshire, and Nurse Brexit played her part. This was pantomime at its best and an absolute hoot.



The Courtyard was by contrast all rather boring. The sets and costumes were very well done, but it was more of a musical than a pantomime, which bore no relation to the story. At the end of Act 1 we had very little idea what was going on. I suggested we go for a curry but was persuaded to sit it out. The second half improved, but frankly none of it was a patch on Snow White.
