

What follows here summarises matters of particular interest and any decisions taken at a specific meeting.

## The Regular Meeting of Dilwyn Parish Council held in the St. Mary's CE Primary School, Dilwyn on

At this meeting, 8 Councillors were present, with apologies from Cllrs. I. Brown, D. Brown, A. Brown and E. Stilwell; the Parish Clerk, Mr. Gwilym Rippon and Ward Cllr. M. Cooper were in attendance; there were no members of the public present.

#### a. Public Participation:

- a) To receive the Police report.
  - There was no police presence.
- b) To receive the Ward Councillor's report.

The Ward Member highlighted the need for vulnerable members of the public to receive the flu vaccine, and talked about road maintenance and cyber security.

c) Questions from members of the public.

There were no members of the public present.

## b. To approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting on Tuesday, $7^{\rm th}$ November, 2018.

#### **RESOLVED**

The minutes of the Regular Meeting on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 were approved.

#### c. Information arising from the minutes.

• Cllr. Gerrish reported that the ditch has not been dealt with at Rose Cottage.

#### d. Correspondence received:

A member of the public asked if the Council has any intention to repair the home guard hut. Council was aware that there was a considerable amount of asbestos present and it was felt it would be cost prohibitive for the Council to carry out repairs.

A letter had been received regarding the War Memorial. (See Item 11)

#### e. Finance:

a) To note the bank balances for November 2018.

The Clerk reported the following

b) To discuss the National Audit Office guidelines

A document was circulated which, it was proposed, be sent to the Dilwynner for inclusion in the next edition.

c) To discuss and approve invoices for payment. Details may be seen on the Parish Council website and village notice-boards. The Clerk was instructed to pay all invoices.

#### f. Highway matters:

a) Balfour Beatty.

Potholes at Sollers Dilwyn.

b) Work for Lengthsman:

A list had been received from the Lengthsman and it was agreed that this work would be carried out.

#### g. Planning matters

There was nothing to report under this heading.

#### h. The adding of the name of Sargent Noble to the War Memorial

A request had been received for the placing of an additional name on the Village War Memorial. The Council felt that precedent could be set and decided that the Clerk should respond to the request by explaining the feelings of the Council.

#### i Carols on the Green

It was noted that this is an important event for the village, and that it is highly desirable that members of the Council are seen to be involved.

#### j. Update on the Neighbourhood Development Plan:

Dilwyn Neighbourhood Development Plan - Consideration of Representations made at the Regulation 14 stage and to determine whether to forward the revised draft plan to

Herefordshire Council under Regulation 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning regulations.

#### RESOLVED

It was agreed to forward the Dilwyn Neighbourhood Development Plan, as amended, to Herefordshire Council under Regulation 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations.

#### k. The Crown Inn

The Licensees have received an award by **CAMRA: 'Pub of the Season'**. Council members congratulated Maria and Max on this achievement.

There has been a suggestion that a sign be bought plus a plaque showing that the Crown had received the CAMRA award.

## Dilwyn Parish Council Complaints Procedure

It is always to be hoped that complaints about Council procedures or actions will be few and far between. However, should a complaint be thought to be necessary, there is a definite procedure that must be followed. This is set out in a document published by the National Audit Office that can be seen on the Dilwyn Parish Council website. To help in understanding a very lengthy document, a summary of the most salient points follows this piece.

Sadly, over the last six years, Dilwyn Parish Council has suffered from a number of complaints, at the rate one per year. The only one of these that proved to be justified was, subsequently, properly dealt with by the Council. Although the other complaints were deemed to be unwarranted, they nevertheless necessitated payments of more than £8000 in additional external auditor's fees, all of which comes from the precept – effectively out of the pockets of every householder!

Any parishioner has, of course, the right to complain, should there be something of concern, and the Parish Council would most certainly want to respond to any such. However, there must be a proper procedure and this, to be helpful, is laid out in the aforementioned NAO document. Unfortunately, the recent Dilwyn complainants have not followed this procedure and have gone directly to the external auditor; the matter will, of course, be investigated, but at a cost – hence the £8000+! (A figure that can be checked by reference to the Council website.) It can clearly be seen, therefore, how undesirable and, indeed, incorrect it is to lodge a complaint with an external auditor in the first instance. Rather, should there be a complaint on any matter that might come within the jurisdiction of the Parish Council, the first contact should always be with the Parish Clerk, Gwilym Rippon. (Contact details below). The matter would most certainly be dealt with promptly and efficiently. Should the complainant then not be satisfied with the outcome, that is the time to go elsewhere, but not before.

It is very much to be hoped that, when necessary, this simple procedure will always be followed by everyone.

#### NATIONAL AUDIT OFFICE

Local authorities spend public money; this money comes from national and local taxes and the local authorities must tell local residents and taxpayers how their money is spent.

A small authority, such as Dilwyn, is required to publish its annual return locally, including on a website. As a local resident you have legal rights to inspect, ask questions about and challenge items in your authority's accounts. Anybody can ask a question, but only local electors can ask questions formally.

If you want information about your local authority's income or spending, first ask the authority. Most local authorities publish details of their spending on their websites. If you do not have internet access, you can ask your authority to send you a copy of what it publishes by contacting the Parish Clerk, in the case of Dilwyn, Gwilym Rippon..

You might want to tell someone your view of how the authority runs its services. You can, without exercising legal rights, tell the authority about these issues at any time, by writing either to the Parish Clerk or to a Parish Councillor.

If, subsequently, you are concerned about the way in which the authority is managing its business or finances, or are dissatisfied with the action the authority has taken in response to an issue you have raised, you can then bring your concerns to the attention of the local external auditor at any time. by writing.

To ask the external auditor a question or make an objection about accounts, you need to know:

ï who the authority's external auditor is;

ï your legal rights;

NAC

ï when you can exercise them;

i what an external auditor can and cannot do;

i the costs involved. Please bear in mind that the costs of any action taken are borne by local taxpayers, and local public auditors have a duty to ensure that their response is proportionate and that they remain mindful of the amounts of public money involved.

Information on any of these issues may be obtained by reference to the document, *Guide* published by the National Audit Office, which may be found on the Dilwyn Parish Council website.

Please remember: In the first instance, you should always raise your concerns with the authority and attempt to resolve the issue with the authority directly. Access to the Dilwyn Parish Council website is best gained by using the link on www.dilwyn.com



### **Nature Notes**



Just days after I had completed my last set of Nature Notes in mid December, a pair of white egrets came to visit Dilwyn Common, spending a couple of days investigating the wet grassland. On the 7<sup>th</sup> of January, a single white egret appeared on the same field (pointed out to me by Caroline and other dog walkers, who have watched with interest) and hung around for a week or so. These birds look rather like herons but are pure white. Many of these striking birds over-winter on the Somerset Levels, so perhaps our visitors were making their way there and had stopped for a rest.

The mild weather of late December and early January has encouraged some early flowering. Last year the early daffodils growing at the end of The Glebelands came into flower on the 1<sup>st</sup> of February. The same patch came into flower on 30<sup>th</sup> December this last year – so effectively they flowered twice in a year! A walk along the road between Hi-Lo Field Cottage and Quicksetts, revealed a patch of deadnettles and some periwinkles in flower on the 7<sup>th</sup> January. The comparative warmth to begin the new year has certainly encouraged the birds to sing. No sign of our usual thrush but several robins, dunnocks and blackbirds have been tuning up ready for spring. I heard a great tit in good voice in mid January, with his easily identifiable 'teacher, teacher' song. The chasing games may have begun but winter could yet descend late upon us – as it did last year.

## Dilwyn Weather Watch For December 2018



Although the final week of the year was dry, several days of heavy rain earlier in the month had produced a December rainfall figure of 4 inches (100mm), bringing the total rainfall for 2018 to 34 inches (850mm) – a fairly average amount over the past 7 years. The daytime temperature averaged 10 degrees (slightly above normal)

and the night time average was 3 degrees (only 4 nights had a frost) – also a little high. Only 3 days were 'mostly sunny', in fact sunshine was in short supply as clouds, rain, mist etc became the order of the day. Several days had a stiff breeze blowing but no major storm systems bothered us.

A wet and dreary month to summarise!

However, the problem does not appear to have galvanised any action; it is reported by the engineers of Hereford Parish Council that, during the last five years, there has not been a single report from any Dilwyn resident!

No driver can be unaware of the terrible state of our roads, with the number and size of potholes seemingly increasing constantly and very rapidly. Dilwyn Parish Council regularly reports these defects, but very few actually receive attention. It is, of course, understandable that the sheer scale of the problem places an immense burden on the County Council, but there is an obvious risk that any one complaint may get lost in the overall mass that is lodged. It also seems to be the case that the report of an individual is likely to receive more attention than that of an organisation such as a Parish Council.

Consequently, your Parish Council recommends most strongly that all of us, as individuals, become involved by reporting any holes in the immediate vicinity of where we live. Obviously, if many of us were to do so, the whole area could be covered. It would appear to be fact that the greater the number of complaints, the more likely is the repair to be carried out!

## Weobley & District Branch Report of a meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2019

On 3rd January Lizzie Croose – Mustelid Conservation Officer of The Vincent Wildlife Trust spoke about The Masked Mustelid – Plotting the Path of the Polecat in Britain.

The polecat is the ancestor of the domestic ferret. They have been present in Great Britain, but not Ireland, since the last Ice Age, and in the Mesolithic period they were the third most abundant 'mustelid', after weasels and pine martens. Human persecution meant they were rare in England by 1880 and almost wiped out in all the UK by 1915. After WW1 there were many fewer gamekeepers, and in the 1950s gin-traps were made illegal and so the species began to recover from a foothold in mid-Wales, and is now once more quite widespread, and with some interbreeding with escaped domestic ferrets... particularly in the south and east of the UK...

In 2014-15 there were 78 records of polecats in Herefordshire, about half of these identified from roadkill, but camera traps, accidental live trappings and human encounters account for other reports.

The true species shows some variations in markings but is generally quite dark coloured and on its face has a brown/black mark like the mask of the "Lone-Ranger" It nests in rabbit burrows, log piles or sometimes under garden sheds and it mostly feeds on wild rabbits, but also prevs on rats.

These days farmers and gamekeepers mostly do not regard them as a threat, and they are a protected species, but they do suffer from ingesting pesticide... mostly rodenticides put down to kill rats. The polecats then eat the contaminated prey, which has perhaps become easy to catch or is dead already. Nonetheless, we heard that polecats are on the increase in UK though they are in decline across most of mainland Europe.

The talk was beautifully illustrated with numerous slides and video clips and the meeting was further enlivened by the presence of Stanley, a live, three year old polecat who enjoyed much attention.

## **February Recipe**

## Mrs. Howard's lemon surprise pudding

This is a family favourite, good all year round, but particularly so at this time of year. It has a lemony sponge top, and underneath a rich gooey base.

75g softened butter grated rind and juice of 2 large lemons 150g caster sugar 50g flour 3 eggs separated. 200ml milk



Cream together butter, caster sugar and yolks (beat yolks first) and the lemon zest and juice. to make a thick batter. Gently .fold in the whipped egg whites, and pour mixture into a 1.2 litre souffle dish or similarly deep dish. Place the dish in a roasting tin and pour sufficient boiling water from the kettle to come a third of the way up the side of the dish.

Bake in the oven at 180 degrees for about 45/55 minutes until puffed, golden and firm to a flat hand. Serve hot or cold. I don't think it needs cream but there are others who think cream or crème fraiche is a good addition!
