# **Arturo**

My Christmas present that year was to be a 6 day riding holiday, 6 hours a day in the saddle in the Gredos Mountains. The Gredos Mountains are about 75 miles due west of Madrid with some of the most beautiful scenery imaginable. But, I had always assumed that if the Good Lord had meant me to ride a horse he would never have invented the motor car. Steps had clearly to be taken.

We had about 5 months to go and so most weekends found the Herdmen on horseback, either in Sussex or Herefordshire.

By May I could sit on a horse without a feeling of complete terror.

Maria Elena runs a superb organization. We were a group of 12 riders and I was assigned Arturo, a fine chestnut. On top of the saddle was a numna, and the whole thing was most comfortable.

For 6 days we made a broad sweep along Cañadas, old cattle trails, of which there are 1,000s of kilometres in Spain. Criss crossing the Tormes river, usually at fords where Wellington crossed on his Peninsular campaign. Clattering into deserted villages at 1,700 metres, with a shutter banging to and fro mournfully in the wind, and a water trough, fountain fed, still working perfectly. It was straight out of "A fistful of dollars" and at any moment we expected to meet Clint Eastwood or hear the famous 3 note trailing whistle.

We made a broad circle travelling perhaps 15 miles a day and at the end one had survived with no broken bones. Arturo put up with his burden stoically, but he had one tiresome habit. He would tread on my foot when I was standing by him. Not once but with monotonous regularity. I put this down to incompetence on my part and tried to keep my feet out of his way.

Every January Maria Elena would come to London and give a party for guests



past and potentially future. Some years later at one of these I was talking to a horsewoman clearly of great experience. She had already been to the Gredos a couple of times, moreover she too had ridden Arturo

"Tell me", I asked her "did he have any little ways with you." "Yes," she said forcefully "he used to keep on treading on my foot!"

# **Neighbourhood Watch**



#### Telephone "Taxpayers" Scam

This is a telephone scam where an automated message is left, making it seem as if it's from HMRC, and stating that HMRC are bringing a lawsuit against the individual. The recipient is then asked to call 0161 8508494 and press '1' to speak to the officer dealing with the case. This is a sophisticated new scam and we advise the public not to respond or divulge any of their personal details. HMRC takes security very seriously, but everyone needs to be alert. If you cannot verify the identity of the person making the call you should not disclose your personal details. Please report any such incidents on the Action Fraud website, or contact them on 0300 123 2040 (This number will be charged at your normal network rate). They are open Monday to Friday 09:00-18:00. #### Not sure? Don't open the door!

Protect yourself from doorstep crime. Be aware of people who turn up unannounced, most genuine callers will have a pre-arranged appointment. If in doubt, keep them out! Doorstep crime can include rogue traders offering home improvement or gardening services, or bogus callers who claim to be the council, police, health carers or energy companies.

Rogue traders may say they are in the area working on another property and they have spotted a problem with your home or garden. They may claim to have materials left over from another job, like paving or tarmac. They may try to pressurise you to buy goods or sign up for services on the spot. Unfortunately all too often they may offer to carry out work cheaply , but charge an extortionate price after the work has been completed.

Bogus callers may claim to be working for the council, water, gas or electric company. They could also say they are a nurse, doctor or even from the police. Bogus callers may say they need to come into your home, or try to get you to go outside. They may try to distract you so they can steal your money. They can be male, female or even children. A pedlar is someone who calls at your door to sell items that they have to offer, This can often include cleaning or household goods. These goods may be sold at an overpriced value. By law pedlars are required to carry a pedlar's certificate, which is issued by the police force in the area they operate.

If you are not sure who is at the door, do not open it. Check the identity of any caller. Confirm who they are by calling the company they work for by using the number from the telephone directory or from off one of your bills. Do not call a number provided by them.

If caller does not leave your property when asked to do so, call the police.

# The Regular Meeting of Dilwyn Parish Council held in the St. Mary's CE Primary School, Dilwyn on

At this meeting, 5 Councillors were present, with apologies from Cllrs. T. Kyles, R. Brown, D. Brown, A. Brown, J. Lewis and J. Hall; the Parish Clerk, Mr. Gwilym Rippon was in attendance; there were four members of the public present.

The Clerk replied that there was a need for a suitable unearmarked reserve to cover the higher than normal cost of audit, due to the fact that every year for six years there had been a complaint under audit. The additional cost for this over that period is in excess of £8000.

November was a better month again with us putting **15850 litres** through the syndicate, well done to everyone involved, over and above with some fill ups probably

about 16000 litres.

The price had actually fallen to **46.95p** per litre nearly 6p cheaper than October, delivery was from Beacon Fuels and again very prompt, The other prices were Watson at 53p and Oil4Wales at 49.5, I could not get replies in time from the other two companies and had to get the order done, Beacon came in at an excellent price and checking on the price structure they were well below average.

As a matter of interest Boiler Juice .com would have been 59.75p per litre, they are not the cheapest as people may think, admin charges are included.

Over the last month the trend has fallen again dramatically with a slow rise and fall on the way, 18th November started at £470 per 900 litres, falling quickly over a period of about 13 days to a low of £437 on 4th December, then rising slowly, levelling off on the way to a price of £450 on the 18th. I am ordering now so the price should still be fair, this month is short because I want to hope fully get a pre Christmas delivery.

Have fun and look forward to the Spring, the shortest day has gone.

# Why January?





# **Nature Notes**



A time of scarce natural supplies for our wild birds, means that the food which we put out for them is particularly important. Stored apples need careful checking and any blemishes will soon cause many around them to decay, so put them out for the blackbirds, thrushes and fieldfares to feed on. Scraps of bread, cheese, biscuits etc will all be gladly received by our feathered friends, as of course will seeds, nuts and fat-balls specially bought for the purpose. Although it may cost a few pounds, we always reckon that the pleasure to be

had from watching an assortment of wild birds in your garden is well worth it. On the weekend of 26-28<sup>th</sup> January 2019, the Big Garden Birdwatch takes place, run by the RSPB. Counting your garden birds for an hour on either day could contribute to a national database and help plan for the future – find out which of our birds need help to survive.

# Dilwyn Weather Watch For November 2018



Three and a half inches of rain (86mm) helped our ongoing year's total for 2018 up to 30 inches (740mm). It was a fairly typical November, with cloud and mists making everything feel cold and damp. Only six days out of thirty could be called 'sunny', with a

couple more having a few hours of sunshine. Near the month end, Storm Diane was swiftly followed by even more rain and wind, enough to cause some disruption and our first local signs of flooding. Daytime temperatures averaged 11 degrees and night times averaged 4, the warmest day climbing to 16 and the lowest night falling to minus 4.

# Yet Another Life Lesson

In the summer of 1974 I was detached to RAF Biggin Hill, along with my friend Kev, as part of the groundcrew for that year's air display. We were going to be there for 10 days seeing aircraft in as they arrived at the airfield and positioning them on static display, marshalling aerobatic teams and solo aircraft during the practise week and on the day itself. Prior to all of this the first day was spent having briefings, and familiarising ourselves with SO's (Station Orders), where various sections were, SHQ, the mess, NAAFI and so on.

Despite being pre HSE our first 'serious' briefing was from the airfield fire section. We were billeted in 9 man caravans as the permanent accommodation could only cope with a certain amount of extra 'bods' and the lecture was taken by an RAF Regiment sergeant, who set about his task with gusto and forceably imparted to us the gravity of the information he was sharing about fire regs in the caravans, not drying laundry on the heaters, no smoking etc. etc. There were other briefings but none delivered so pointedly although they took up all of Monday, so after tea we went to wind down with a pint, with our new found chums from various other stations, relishing the proper work the following day.

Tuesday we actually spent meeting our Senior NCO's and being given the run down on arrival times of the aircraft starting on Wednesday, then the real job would begin. On that day, after breakfast, we found our way to the hut on the airfield, that would be our office for the next 8 days, and from this location we marshalled several types of aircraft from several different Air Forces around the globe. Most of the types were familiar, as the majority were RAF but there were exceptions as Belgian, Dutch, German, Italian, goddam yanks- you get the picture, followed each other to this great wartime station. During the day we heard 'vague rumours' of a small domestic fire that had occurred somewhere on the unit which had briefly piqued our interest, quickly disappearing when no substantial information was forthcoming. The day passed and soon it was 1700 hours and playtime ended, we headed for tea. In the mess there was a certain buzz of excitement and as we sat at table, amid murmurings of the earlier fire circulating the room, we



discovered, that although all reasonable care had been taken to alert us of the consequences, a caravan had indeed been burned to the ground that very day. Armed with this terrible news we hardly tasted tea as we cleared our plates in double time in order to leave and offer our heartfelt condolences to the unfortunate occupants of said caravan. On arriving at the site of the burned out shell our sympathies rapidly dissolved and despite our best endeavours we erupted into gleeful, almost maniacal laughter.....the caravan that had been destroyed was the temporary residence of 9 firemen from RAF Scampton. It took a great deal of willpower to stop ourselves joining hands and dancing around it. Fortunately it had been empty but it did transpire that a damp towel left drying on the heater was the source.

Before we left for our own units there was an end of display party thrown in one of the flying clubs after the weekend of displays. All personnel had been duly invited and we made our way across the airfield, 7 up in a Spitfire (Triumph and not Supermarine) not recommended, particularly as I was on the bottom.....I would like to point out that at no time did we take to public roads but have no doubt that the C.O. would have cared little for that had he known!!!!!

Going into the Club we discussed the possibility of pulling and scanned the area for likely targets; we soon realised even in our brightly coloured, penny round collared shirts and dungarees it would not be our night, once the aircrews in blazers, complete with team badges, smart pressed trousers had picked off the cream of the ladies and the NCO's had sorted through the best of the remains, we were still behind the firemen who dazzled the girls of our own age with their tale of woe....what's that about who laughs last.

# Weobley & District Wildlife

On Thursday 6th December 34 members and friends of Weobley and district branch of Herefordshire Wildlife Trust were treated to a delightful evening of show and tell and music by Hop Pickers Feast and seasonal refreshments too. Mr. Ian Wren and his two stalwart musicians played so ably it was a real pleasure to hear them. Sean Kingston was the first to participate in the show and tell. He showed photos of a badger taken by his son age 13 years who had been given his first camera. One of the photos was full frontal and of such good resolution that many of us would have liked to say we had taken it. Graham Saunders followed with an illustrated talk on the tree, Ginko Biloba which can grow to 30 metres high with leaves of two lobes hence its name. Fossils have been dated to 2 hundred million years ago. It can survive cold and heat and being slow growing often lives for two and a half thousand years. There is one in Chelsea Physic Garden and a beautiful specimen grows in Kinnersley Castle grounds. It is widely used in herbal medicine as it improves circulation and is therefore used for angina and vascular dementia. Robert Williams showed six photographs and spoke of Aymestry Limestone, its place in the geology of N.W. Herefordshire and the people who published books about it. People like Rev. Thomas Taylor Lewis, an able naturalist interested in rocks and fossils who was vicar of Bridstow near Ross on Wye. Sir Roderick Murchison with his friend Sedgwick set about establishing an understanding of the geology of Wales in 1831. Murchison named the Silurian system after an Iron Age tribe, the Silures, and published his seminal work on the subject in 1839. He also had dealings with Thomas Andrew Knight who lived in Downton Castle and was the author of the Herefordshire Pomona. Finally Robert showed us a photo of Kirkidium Knighti, a marine fossil which is set in the wall of Aymestry church in a block of Aymestry limestone. It is dated to over 400 million years ago. Charles Overton showed photos of carnivorous plants . These grow in nitrogen deficient soil in full sunlight. These insect eating plants catch their prey in three different ways, pit fall trap, mechanical trap and fly paper trap. They are temperate loving and grow outside happily to various heights. The Venus fly trap, Dionaea Muscipula has trigger hairs which require 2 touches to effect closure. How does this plant time and sense it's reaction to touch? Dave Burr spoke and illustrated the topic of two fish which are found in the river Wye. The shad is a relative of the herring and comes to the river to spawn. The other, a sea lamprey was not a very beautiful fish. It has one nostril and one eye, is parasitic and uses its head to shift stones to prepare his redd. He will cooperate with other males to move larger stones or small rocks. Hedley Boyce was next with a tale of the owl nesting box given him as a retirement present. This was eventually inhabited by a pair of tawny owls which hatched a brood. These owlets became used to Hedley working in his garden and fledged successfully. Ian Sterry showed some delightful photos of the birds in his garden thus ably demonstrating the pleasure to be gained by studying the bird life close to home. Mary Stevenson moved with her husband to Eaton Bishop a few years ago and the beauty of the place made a great impression on them both. The view from her back garden is fantastic especially with a rainbow. Simple things like a cross section of a thick branch of purple beech, a field of potatoes tilled and earthed up and the shine of the rain on cobbled stones of an old stone path gave much pleasure. Lewis Goldwater was our last contributor. He is a reserves officer and our contact at the Herefordshire Wildlife Trust. He spoke of the importance of water to all age groups and the various ways and places volunteers can work for the trust.




