



a. Public Participation:

- To receive the Police report.

 There was no police officer present.
- The Ward Councillor was not present.
- The member of public asked why the Crown Inn had been closed for three days; it was explained that a deep-clean had taken place
- b. To approve the General Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, 5th December, 2017

RESOLVED

The minutes of the General Parish Council meeting of 5th December 2017 were approved.

c. Information arising from the minutes.

- (item 6) In relation to the Hedge at The Coach House this will be followed up.
- (item 7) The memorial seat has been placed in the centre of the village.
- (item 9) No information had been received in respect of the grit bin

d. Correspondence received:

One letter has been received in respect of the allocation of social housing within Dilwyn. The Clerk to explore the issue of why the Council are not contacted in respect of local connections.

e. Finance:

- · The Clerk reported the following

The Lengths-man was to be informed that there had been flooding at Sandpits corner and also that the ditch along the Common by Rose Cottage had not been cleared.

It was reported that there had been fly-tipping on the Weobley side of the bypass, which had been reported to Balfour Beatty, and it had also been reported that there was a blocked drain. It was very pleasing to note that these were dealt with very swiftly.

g. Planning matters

There was nothing to report under this heading.

h. Carols on the Green

This event, held inside at the Crown because of the awful weather, had been very successful. It was pointed out that there would be a requirement for a replacement Santa next year. There was some discussion as to whether the date should be changed to compensate for late-night shopping.

i. The Parish Council Website

It was pointed out that there was some information missing on the website. This would be dealt with.

j. Update on the Neighbourhood plan

It was reported that the Secretary had resigned. It was also pointed out that the documents produced by the Neighbourhood Plan should be available to members of the public. Dilwyn Parish Council is very pleased to announce the appointment of a Tree Warden: Tony McQueen. The Council is delighted to welcome Tony to Dilwyn and is very grateful to him for being willing to take on the role. To introduce himself, Tony has written what follows:

Tree Wardens

The Tree Warden Scheme is a national initiative to enable people to play an active role in conserving and enhancing their local trees and woods. The scheme was founded and is co-ordinated by The Tree Council. Tree Wardens are volunteers, appointed by parish councils or other community organisations, who gather information about their local trees, get involved in local tree matters and woods. So essentially, it is to champion trees. For details go to http://www.treecouncil.org.uk

A few clicks here will take you to a considerable list of accomplishments and abilities that a tree warden supposedly has. Here I need to strike a note of realism. I am an individual with an enthusiasm for trees but I have no great knowledge, no lifetime as a forester, estate manager, tree surgeon, no degree in silviculture, arboriculture, etc. I am a lover of trees with the aim of being useful and the scheme backs up its wardens with training and support. Though nearer to Weobley than Dilwyn (Weobley already has a warden), I am only a few miles away. In the spring, I will be endeavouring to gain local knowledge and make myself known in line with the above.

Passiontide Concert at St Marys

Saturday 24 March at Dilwyn Church

Our church plays host to a concert of Passiontide music from Academia Musica choir, the scholars' choir from Hereford Sixth Form College. The choir has an impressive history with tours to Belgium, Italy and Germany in recent years, performances at St John's Smith Square, St Paul's Cathedral, Trinity College Cambridge and Wells Cathedral and two CD recordings with Priory Records of the church music of John Sheppard.

The choir's regular routine sees them sing Choral Evensong in Hereford Cathedral on most Wednesday afternoons during term time as well as some collaboration concerts with the English Symphony Orchestra (including a performance of Haydn's Missa in Tempore Belli on March 14 this year).

Academia Musica consists of student choral scholars and a number of adult singers, including some professional "musicians-in-residence", and gives the scholars the best opportunity to join elite choirs and obtain choral scholarships as they further their education at universities and conservatoires. Former scholars now sing with choirs such as the Clothmakers Consort in Leeds and the Ebor Singers in York. Some have gone on to choral directing, and one former scholar got in touch 6 months ago to say that he'd performed in the Proms over the summer. Meanwhile, one alumnus is now singing with the choir of Merton College, Oxford whilst a current scholar has been offered a place in that same choir for next year. Directed by Jon Weller, the choir's programme includes the famous Miserere by Allegri, featuring that soaring top C from the solo soprano. They will also sing music from composers such as Scarlatti, Byrd, Tomkins and Sarah MacDonald, director of Selwyn College Choir in Cambridge.

Nature Notes



With some quite chilly weather still about in mid February, seed planting is still for the brave or the well insulated. The gardens are beginning to brighten, with a few green shoots adding to the effect of snowdrops, crocuses and early daffodils.

Birdsong is getting earlier and holds more urgency. We are often awakened by our neighbourhood thrush singing his heart out from the top of a nearby tree, beginning before dawn. Robins can be seen and heard everywhere as they claim territory and try to impress their mates. Blackbirds, dunnocks and great tits are all in full voice at this time of year. Great tits have a variety of songs but the one you will easily recognise is their call of 'teacher, teacher'. Not sure why that one always sticks in my mind! Dunnocks were often known as hedge sparrows because of their likeness to house or tree sparrows. We have two pairs at least in our garden and on close inspection you realise that they are very pretty little birds. The head is blue/grey, as is the chest. The back and sides are brown with darker streaks, and they have pale pink legs. The beak is thinner than that of a sparrow, as it is used for catching insects rather than eating seeds. They are lively little birds, often seen hopping along hedge bottoms and flower beds. Their nests are often invaded by cuckoos, which will lay one egg to replace the dunnock's eggs. Busy little parent dunnocks then spend several weeks feeding one hungry cuckoo chick - and never seem to notice the difference! AR



Weather Watch

Dilwyn Weather for January 2018

Three inches of rain fell (75mm) in a damp feeling January - only 6 dry days and three of those were cloudy or foggy. Five days were mostly sunny in an otherwise dull and drab month. Daytime temperatures averaged 9 degrees and night times just 1 degree. The warmest day got up to 12 degrees and the coldest night got to minus 5 degrees. 14 nights had a frost recorded.

Thinking back 5-6 years to the time when I was teaching at St Mary's, Dilwyn, there were two young ladies I remember well, who both played guitar. Eleanor and Georgina will be well into their secondary school careers by now (good luck with GCSEs when they arrive girls!). The reason they are mentioned here is that the two storms which struck the British Isles in January were called Storm Eleanor (3rd, 4th Jan) and Storm Georgina (24th Jan). Quite a coincidence! One storm worthy of naming that the forecasters missed, came in mid month and was recorded at 60mph at Shobdon airfield. This was the strongest to hit Herefordshire and caused some tree damage locally.

The Masked Mustelid - Plotting the Path of the Polecat in Britain

Lizzie Croose, Mustelid Conservation Officer at The Vincent Wildlife Trust will be coming along to the Branch on Thursday 1st March to talk about Polecats, an animal with particular local significance to mid-Wales and the Marches.

The polecat became extinct in many areas of lowland Britain by the end of the 19th century but more recently, polecats have spread out from their historical stronghold in mid Wales and recolonised much of southern and central England and have recently reached parts of south-west England and East Anglia. The polecat's conservation status in Britain is much more favourable today than it was a hundred years ago. Provided that no new serious threats emerge to halt the current recovery, it seems likely that the polecat will become widely re-established in mainland Britain.
