The lovely sunshine of early April was just what we needed after some rather gloomy, cloudy winter months. Suddenly the verges and field margins had flowers blooming, the trees and hedges took on that delightful shade of green which we so look forward to, and birds and insects took to the air ready for a new breeding season. Whilst a couple of my nest boxes see regular comings and goings (sparrows and blue tits), one of our near neighbours has gone one better. The T.V. in his conservatory is linked to a nest box out in the garden and shows a great tit who is now sitting on 6-7 eggs. Dave invited me round for a look, and the picture is very good. He has followed the progress of this nest, from building, to egg laying and currently to incubation. By the time this magazine is distributed, there should be feeding of young under way. Perhaps it is time I tried to catch up with the advance of technology! We do have some nests – a thrush well hidden amongst thick foliage and a pair of goldfinches in a tree in the garden. Robins, blackbirds and chaffinches we are sure have nests nearby but so far we have not seen them. Perhaps when they are feeding young we shall.

Dilwyn Weather for March 2017

3.3 inches (82mm) fell in March, which is a fairly average rainfall figure. The year to date now stands at just over 8 inches (200mm). There were a few breezy days, making the daffodils dance but no major wind systems. Temperatures also stayed close to average and there were the expected few light frosts at night. Daytime temperatures averaged 13 degrees, night time averaged 3 degrees. Eleven days were 'mostly' sunny and on the best of these temperatures crept up to 16 degrees, which makes for a pleasant spring day!

The full, approved minutes of Dilwyn Parish Council meetings, as prepared by the Parish Clerk, are published regularly on the Village Notice Boards and Website. What follows here summarises matters of particular interest and any decisions taken at a specific meeting.

Sincere apologies are recorded here for the fact that, due to an incorrect submission of copy to the Editor, the report on the draft minutes for March were printed in the April Dilwynner. A Hereford & Worcester Animal Rescue Story

The arrival of Rufus in our lives came as a bit of a surprise. We had to have our beautiful Beagle, Honey put to sleep and somehow the sadness we felt wouldn't go away. Whenever anyone asked 'Will you have another dog?' the answer was always a firm 'No!' Then out of the blue David confessed that he really missed having a dog and could we consider having another one. Well it wasn't an overnight decision. We spent a lot of time online looking at dogs that were looking for new homes, having had several rescue dogs over the years. We had seen pictures of this long-legged dog, whose name at the time was Ivor, in the window of The Hereford & Worcester Animal Rescue Charity Shop in Leominster. He had lively brown eyes and a lovely, curly, russet coloured coat. On the spur of the moment, whilst out shopping, we called the Hereford & Worcester Animal Rescue phone number and asked if Ivor was still looking for a home. Luckily for us he was and we went to see him that afternoon. We were told that he was about 5 or 6 year's old but he certainly seemed very lively and had a lot to say for himself! (And still does!)

We decided not to take the decision that afternoon but I could see that David was smitten and it was no surprise that when we got home, he said the thought that, in spite of not knowing much about Ivor's background, he liked him a lot and what did I think? I too liked him and felt that he needed another chance. He had such a beautiful coat and long legs which he stretched out in a very elegant way! How could we say no? We picked him up the following week and decided that a name change was in order. He became Rufus and has been with us for almost 9 months. He would only drink in the garden at first but is much more settled now and showing more of his real character. To see him now asleep on his blankets, with his long legs stretched out, gracefully arranged to fit his basket, with what looks remarkably like a smile on his face, is a reward in itself!

Emergency Medical Advice

•Taurus Healthcare is a company that has been set up by the GPs in Herefordshire to provide additional medical services to patients. There are now three primary care hubs (Leominster, Ross and Hereford) open in the county that provide GP and Practice Nursing services for our patients during the evenings and weekends. The hubs are staffed by local GPs and nurses, who will, with your permission, be able to access your medical records. If you need to make an appointment at one of the hubs but your surgery is closed, please phone 111 and ask for an appointment at one of the hubs, alternatively you can ring direct on 0800 121 7221. The Hereford hub is open 6pm to 8pm weekdays and 8am to 8pm weekends and bank holidays.

• There is a GP Walk-In Access Centre at ASDA in Hereford which is open from 8am until 8pm, seven days a week and every day of the year. There is no need to register. You can use these services when it is convenient and keep registered with your practice.

•You can telephone 111. NHS 111 is a new service to make it easier for you to access local NHS healthcare services in England. NHS 111 is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Calls are free from landlines and mobile phones. You should use the NHS 111 service if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation.

The NHS 111 service is staffed by a team of fully trained advisers, supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. They will ask you questions to assess your symptoms, then give you the healthcare advice you need or direct you straightaway to the local service that can help you best.

Where possible, the NHS 111 team will book you an appointment or transfer you directly to the people you need to speak to. If NHS 111 advisers think you need an ambulance, they will immediately arrange for one to be sent to you. Calls to 111 are recorded. All calls and the records created are maintained securely, and will only be shared with others directly involved with your care. Call 111 if:

•You need medical help fast but it's not a 999 emergency

•You think you need to go to A&E or need another NHS urgent care service

•You don't know who to call or you don't have a GP to call

•You need health information or reassurance about what to do next

• A&E is designed to assess and treat people with serious injuries and those in need of emergency treatment. They are open 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year. Typical reasons for going to A&E include:

•Severe breathing problems

•Chest pain and heart attacks

•Severe bleeding

•Major trauma

•Head injuries

•Lack of consciousness

•Severe burns or scalds

•Broken bones

•Severe abdominal pain

•Drug overdose

Normal cuts, bruises and sprains aren't usually considered to be emergencies since these can usually be treated at home or by your GP. A&E shouldn't be used as an alternative to your GP.
