The swifts have left on their long journey back to Africa, while swallows and house martins are gathering on the wires, no doubt to discuss possible routes and re-fuelling stops. Even in mid September my wife and I have both seen house martins and swallows feeding young birds in their nests. These youngsters are going to have to learn to fly and build up strength and stamina quite quickly, if they

are to keep up with their parents as they fly south.

Watch out for bees and hoverflies feeding on the flowers of ivy plants. Especially on warm, sunny days, this can be quite a sight to behold!

Autumn is a lovely time for looking at the changing colours around us. Trees, bushes and garden plants can give a lovely show at this time of year, with ever-changing shades of green, brown, yellow, orange and gold. Take a few minutes to sit and ponder. We are so lucky to live in such a beautiful area. Make the most of it before winter arrives!

#### Weather Watch

#### Dilwyn Weather for August 2017

Nearly 3 inches of rain fell (70mm) during August, which is fairly typical, as August is usually reckoned to be our second wettest month on average! The year's running total now stands at 18.5 inches (462mm). Rainfall was spread fairly evenly over the month. The main surprise was that this year's Bank Holiday weekend was actually sunny!

There were a couple of breezy spells but nothing approaching gales. Pressure remained quite high at between 1000mb and 1025mb but we did not get any long, settled spells of very high pressure. Only 7-8 days were 'mostly sunny'. Temperatures averaged 22 degrees during daylight hours and 8 degrees at night, with a couple of nights recording a minimum of just 1 degree above freezing. Daytimes saw temperatures mostly in the 20s, the highest seen being 28 degrees.

#### **Hedgehog Haven**

#### **Timely Advice**



For many people, their only sighting of a hedgehog is sadly following its demise on the side of the road. 'Sunday' was rescued last year and nurtured back to robust health at the Hedgehog Sanctuary in Bodenham.

She very quickly settled back into her old territory roaming our garden and obviously began socialising in earnest. We now receive regular night visits from a pair of inseparable young hoglets, seen feeding here and captured on the nature cam.

These timid creatures are beginning to make a comeback in our countryside and gardens after many years of decline and following public awareness campaigns and concerned folk putting out food and water, even providing shelter in many cases. 'Sunday' quite happily used the hedgehog house we provided but the youngsters have adopted the compost heap. Hedgehogs will soon be hibernating when the weather turns cooler, so a timely reminder please to check bonfires before lighting as these are another favourite hibernating place. They also need to be over 350 grams in weight to survive the winter and so should be storing body fat now. We put out standard hedgehog food laced with meal worms, which they do love, but not too many because meal worms are junk food in the hedgehog world. Drinking water is also very important, but not milk which can make them ill.

With a little patience, shelter and food hedgehogs could soon be regularly visiting your garden and you can have the satisfaction of helping to conserve these lovely little creatures.

The Regular Meeting of Dilwyn Parish Council held in the St. Mary's CE Primary School, Dilwyn on Tuesday, 4th July 2017

At this meeting, 10 Councillors were present, with apologies from Cllrs. R. Brown and E. Stilwell. The Ward Member, Cllr. Mark Cooper and the Parish Clerk, Mr. Gwilym Rippon were in attendance; there were seven members of the public present.

#### a. Public Participation:

- To receive the Police report.

  The Clerk read out the police report which was noted.
- To receive the Ward Councillor's report.

  The Ward member gave his report; he stated that he had been contacted by a number of residents in relation to the Crown not being open on the hottest day of the year.

### b. To approve the General Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2017 <u>RESOLVED</u>

The minutes of the General Parish Council meeting of 6th June 2017 were approved.

#### c. Correspondence received:

The Clerk read out a request to add the name of a recently deceased member of the armed services to the War Memorial. The Clerk was requested to contact the War Graves Commission to enquire as to the criteria / protocol.

It was agreed that, in future, the Lengths-man should be utilised to keep the weeds down on a regular basis, rather than expecting members of the community to do the work.

#### St Mary's School Report







The new term saw Charlie, Maria, Amelia, Drew, Annabel, Evie, Jude, Molly, Fergus, Sam and Ashleigh moving on to their respective High Schools. We have also gained 8 new pupils in Reception and a further 5 throughout the school that lifts our numbers to a very healthy 56. Our capacity was originally 56 when we opened in 2013. We wish the leavers good luck in their educational journey and give our newcomers a warm welcome and hope that they will enjoy their time at St Mary's. You may have noticed that there have some changes over the summer months. A new gate and fence and repairs and painting throughout the school. At the school entrance further development of the infant's outdoor play area will further stimulate the development of the infant's playing and socialising skills.

Education in our school is all about teaching, learning and progress. Last year's results at both KS1 and KS2 were excellent so it's a big thank you to all the staff concerned. In the Year 1 tests 86% of the children passed all their standards in Reading, Writing and Mathematics (RWM). At KS2 100% of pupils reached the standard in Reading and 91% achieved the national standard in RWM. These results will place us at or near the top of the county league tables as the national average is 61%, a winning formula that will be continued throughout this year. Our monthly quizzes and regular acoustic nights with a wide variety of performers are both proving successful. There is a promise of more performances to come throughout October.





#### Launch of New Book



The Story of Dilwyn, a new book about the parish of Dilwyn, is to be launched at the Cedar Hall on Saturday, 11th November, starting at 2.30pm, with copies on offer at the discounted price of £10 as against the retail price of £12.95. Short talks will be given, refreshments provided and there will be a display of photographs. Tony Hobbs and Andrew Stirling-Brown, each a resident of Dilwyn, one for almost two decades, the other for all his life, have combined to write this book about the parish.

At the time of Domesday there were several manors in the parish, some held by Saxons and others by Normans. Over time these landholdings were amalgamated through marriage or purchase, or split through a divided inheritance, to lead to the pattern of

landholdings in the parish today. This book gives an outline history of some of the post Domesday landowners and their families, along with what is known of the castle site and development of the churches at both Dilwyn and Stretford, and the brief appearance Dilwyn made in the Civil War.

Much of the book then focuses on the past 150 or so years, giving the history of the Great House, Perrymead and the conversion of barns to form Karen Court and the associated creation of the village green. It tells the stories of the school, the local shops, pubs, businesses and some of the farms. It details the arrival of nonconformity, relates anecdotes of the Home Guard during the Second World War, and recounts the writing of The Tangled Garden by Elizabeth Coleman, elements of local folklore, the successes of village cricket and football teams, the construction of the by-pass, and the story of the local WI. The book is well illlustrated with 70 colour and 60 black and white illustrations, and is published by nearby Logaston Press.


