

Mike's Friendly Wave Terremotos Y Tsunami

In 1990 I was at anchor off the port of Antofagasta, Chile awaiting berthing instructions. On the local television I saw that a powerful earthquake had occurred in the Kuril Islands north of Japan. It looked as if it had been quite destructive and I was glad I was not in that vicinity.

I was having lunch when I was called to the bridge because the agent was on the VHF radio and wanted to speak to me. He asked me what I was going to do about this earthquake. I thought what a strange question, an earthquake some 9000 miles and what am I going to do about it. However, his next statement got my full attention. Apparently when earthquakes occur in the Kuril, Tsunamis occur at Chile and vice versa when earthquakes happen in Chile Tsunamis occur at the Kuril.

Waves occur by wind action and normally travel at 20 knots. A Tsunami wave travels at the speed of a jumbo jet . For a ship it is easy to avoid such a wave, providing there is warning. All I had to do was pick up the anchor and steam clear of the banks into deeper water where the wave would pass without problem. When such a wave, traveling at approximately 600mph, comes into shallower waters the energy of that wave channels and gains height. At Antofagasta the recorded heights of such waves had exceeded 26 meters.


A short time later the same agent phoned me to say that the wave had passed Honolulu and that it was a small one and would cause no problems when it arrived off the Chilean coast. "What time will it arrive?" 0500 hours in the morning was the reply.

I set my alarm for 0430 and wandered up to the bridge. The Chief Officer had a brew going and I helped myself to a cupper. The weather was idyllic, calm sea, gentle warm breeze and twilight glow in the east. We discussed the oncoming wave and as the ship was lying in a northerly direction we leaned over the taff rail on the port side looking out to sea, the lights of Antofagasta on the starboard side.

At 0450 Chilean time the ship pitched and rolled to starboard, went over some 12 degrees and leisurely came back to port, rolled again to starboard and back to port then steadied. I looked at the beach and at a white line of a small wave that broke onto the sands. And that was that.

From the Kuril to Antofagasta in 16 hours, I was very glad that this wave was a friendly wave of Nature.



Heating Oil Update

Hi everyone, I just can't believe another month has gone by so quick, here we are October and three months to Christmas.

August was a better month with the hot weather now behind us and the air feeling cooler, the orders started to increase

with a total of 10200 litres, bringing us back to our normal average. The delivery was from Beacon Fuels and I felt that as they had supplied us competitively during the lean two months I would give them the order. They delivered promptly again and I believe they delivered within two days, the price was 49.75p, just under 1p increase from June and 2p from July.

The price trend started at £456 per 900 litres on 21st August and after 5 days it started to rise quite considerably I"m sorry to say. It has actually risen steadily over the month, levelled off during late August with a sudden increase on 2nd September to £476 on the 5th, a few ups and downs over a period of 10 days, then it fell on 18th very slightly to where it is now £475, it's been stable for three days now, pray that it goes down and not up.

We have some new members this month, welcome to you, you really do add to our buying power, enjoy the benefits.

Burial Ground

Advance Warning, St. Mary's Church Burial Ground Extension

St Mary's Church stands, as it has done for over 800 years, in a dominant position at the centre of our village: a landmark and presence that has been witness to hundreds if not thousands of christenings, weddings and funerals for the parish over many generations.

What was once a small Norman church has been adapted and extended over the centuries by members of the village. Despite a thorough Victorian restoration, challenges in recent years have included many structural repairs including the nave roof and stonework, the spire, the clock, the organ and the installation of a loo.

But another bigger challenge is looming. The burial ground, which was enlarged and fenced in 1867, now, 151 years later, is almost "full" and needs

to be extended and re-fenced. Additional ground has been secured but the work of landscaping and fencing will require your support. The PCC is working on those plans but the cost could be substantial.

The PCC must raise these funds if future generations are to be laid to rest in the village. We hope that you will all be able to support future fund-raising activities for this enormous project.



Nature Notes

Conditions this year seem to have favoured many crops but adversely affected others. We had some very cold spells last winter then a late, rather wet spring, followed by a hot, dry summer. I have heard reports of poor crops of early potatoes, runner beans not having the size or flavour they would normally have and certain fruit trees failing completely. On the other hand, we have found huge, early crops of soft fruit and our apple and pear trees

are groaning under the weight of fruit. Our tomatoes have produced a bumper crop too, as have the courgettes and climbing French beans. We have certainly made the most of nature's bounty, with the freezers now being very well stocked!

It is mid September as I write. The swifts are long gone, with swallows and martins now gathering in flocks for the long flight back to Africa. Did anyone else notice that the numbers of these summer visitors was well down this year? Perhaps the weather had an effect on them too? Soon we shall see the winter visitors, as flocks of redwings and fieldfares arrive to take advantage of our berries and fallen apples. Listen out for the robin's song through autumn, as they try to announce their ownership of a particular territory.

Dilwyn Weather Watch For August 2018

Some decent showers of rain after the hot, dry spell of summer were most welcome to gardeners and farmers. Just over 3 inches (82mm) fell to take the year's running total to 20 inches (500mm).

Following more hot, sunny weather in the first week, August settled into its more average showery type weather for the last 3 weeks, with temperatures in the high teens and lower to mid twenties. A couple of nights got quite chilly near month end. Daytime temperatures averaged 23 degrees and night times 11 degrees. The hottest day gave a 31 degree reading, the coldest night reached just 3 degrees.

Pressure remained fairly high, ranging from about 1010mb to 1033mb, with just 3 or 4 days with a strong breeze – otherwise mostly calm. AR


Hedgerows in Autumn



Neighbourhood Development Plan

The draft Neighbourhood Development Consultation (NDP) was prepared by the steering group from the responses to the questionnaire (total of 289 responses given), which was circulated and completed by 10th April 2017.

The results were then analysed by Data Orchard, an independent data analysis company, who reported the findings. These findings are available on the Dilwyn website.

The sites put forward for development by local landowners were also analysed by Data Orchard and a report was again produced called 'Meeting Housing Need and Site Assessment Report' This was completed in June 2018 and is also on the website. The information from these reports allowed the steering group to draft a plan.

One of Life's Lessons

During the recent hot spell I was idly reminiscing about the sixty odd previous summers in comparison to 2018, all was well then I shuddered as I recalled 1989. One Sunday morning in July of that year the family awoke to a glorious day and over breakfast the decision was made to take a trip to the beach. As the car was laden with all the paraphernalia associated with such an outing the excitement of our children increased in intensity and expectation of the adventure ahead.

At the time we lived in Norfolk and within a 30 minute drive north or east would reach the seaside, today we struck out northwards to Sea Palling a favourite location with dunes, flat sand leading down to blue sea and ice cream in a multitude of flavours.

On arrival we disgorged from the car and set about erecting the windbreak in our chosen spot, as the kids sat filling their buckets with the golden grains. When the towels were arranged and Mum lay sunning herself, after applying the girl's suncream, the two older children and I padded down the beach to make sandcastles. After an hour or so I found myself alone as the picnic lunch proved a greater attraction to my daughters so I took the opportunity to go for a swim before I had a sandwich.

I was in my mid 30's and a half decent swimmer, visiting the pool several times a week to do 50 lengths and had also swam off this beach on numerous occasions. This particular day I spent about 10 minutes swimming and then headed back to shore. I emerged from the water and my 5year old ran up to me excitedly pleading that I go back in to show her school friend, who she had met on the beach, how far out I could go, without hesitation or thought I obliged. I swam out at right angles to the coast for 50 metres turned to tread water and wave to my daughter and her friend, who had been joined by my wife and youngest daughter. My 5year old and her friend were jumping up and down to wave back for a minute or two before I started to swim back in. I pulled a few short strokes and felt suddenly odd, I didn't seem to be getting anywhere the tide had turned. A strange fluttering started up in my stomach and I stopped to take stock my wife and youngest still gazing out towards me, the 5year old and her friend gone back to the dunes. I waved and called to my wife to get one of the jet skiers to come out to me, she waved back, turned, unhearing and followed in the footsteps of my departed third born.

I felt bizarrely alone looking at a packed beach 50 metres away, what to do? I composed myself as I remembered panic drains energy so taking deep breaths to maximise oxygen intake I slowly began long, deliberate arm strokes curbing my anxiety as I realised I was making progress.

It seemed an eternity but was probably only a few minutes before I reached the sanctuary of shallow water and safety. I lay on my towel and breathed a sigh of relief thanking all the deities I could think of for my deliverance and grateful I hadn't spoilt my daughters, aged 9, 5 and 18 months day out.

After tucking them all in that night I told my wife but never told the girl's, although in 1994 in Florida my, by then 10 year old, commented that I hadn't swam in the sea for ages, I still haven't to this day. I learnt not to be complacent and still enjoy pursuits involving water.
