Dilwyn Weather for May 2017

A quiet month for weather. Rainfall of two and a quarter inches (56mm), combined with average temperature during daylight hours of 19 degrees, were both much the same as other recent May results. The night time average of 6 degrees was also similar to recent year's results. Three nights showed below zero temperatures, the lowest minus 4 on

the 9th. A breezy spell at the beginning of the month and another half way through were insufficient to cause any disruption. Plenty of sunshine was on offer, with 16 days being mostly sunny and only 3-4 really dull days. The total rainfall for the year to date is now 11 inches (277mm).

The full, approved minutes of Dilwyn Parish Council meetings, as prepared by the Parish Clerk, are published regularly on the Village Notice Boards and Website. What follows here summarises matters of particular interest and any decisions taken at a specific meeting.

At this meeting, 10 Councillors were present, with apologies from Cllrs. R. Brown and T. Kyles, and the Ward Member, Cllr. Mark Cooper; the Parish Clerk, Mr. Gwilym Rippon, was in attendance; there were ten members of the public present.

In due course, a report would be made to Council, but it was emphasised that, while proper consideration would be given, at no stage would there be any obligation on the Council.



These wonderful people visit families at home, giving support to help them overcome a multitude of difficult situations. Our volunteers tend to be parents or have parenting experience. We have male and female volunteers of all ages and from all backgrounds. Some choose to train to volunteer as mentors and others may be experienced in specific fields and offer their support in different ways. All making the commitment to guide and support a family through their troubled time

Before they are matched with a family, an initial recruitment policy is adhered to. All new prospective volunteers attend a course of preparation, have an enhanced criminal records check, and references to support their application.

We now recruiting for our New Year course that starts on the 14th September it will run every Thursday for 10 weeks 9.30 -3pm

Volunteers give 2-3 hours a week to visit a family. In return our volunteers find that they have fun, feel rewarded and honoured that they are allowed into the life of a family. Our volunteers are given excellent training and support, a chance to join in with our social events and all out of pocket expenses are paid.
